This Brahms overture, full of genial high spirits and using jolly German student songs, is scored for the largest orchestra Brahms ever wrote for.

We welcome Liz Rossi from the Hallé Orchestra to perform Mendelssohn's ever-fresh *E minor Violin Concerto*. The virtuoso passages provide ample opportunity for a talented player to display technique, whilst the lyricism of the piece will reveal the performer's deeper interpretative talents. Dmitri Shostakovich's *Symphony No.5 in D minor* is one of his most popular works. Supposedly written as a response to criticism of his *Symphony No.4* and the opera *Lady Macbeth of Mtsensk*, it is said to be one of his most enigmatic works.
