Yuki will be performing Edvard Grieg's enduringly popular piano concerto. The tumultuous opening is one of the most famous in the repertoire and the work has been a mainstay ever since it was premièred in 1869. To follow this we will be performing Antonín Dvořák's *Symphony No.9, 'From the New World'*, which is possibly one of the most popular symphonies of all time. Do not miss. We open the concert with Carl Nielsen's *Rhapsody Overture, 'An Imaginary Journey to the Faroe Islands'*. The work was written in 1927 evoking a sea crossing from Denmark to a celebration in the Faroe Islands and uses motifs from Faroese ballads. Join us for this wonderful music, sure to warm you on a cold November night.

Tonight we welcome the Scarborough Choral Society. They will join us to perform Aaron Copland's *Old American Songs*, based on folk songs and hymns from the 18th & 19th centuries. Originally for voice and piano, Copland adapted them for voice and orchestra and, due to their popularity, for choir as well. Famous songs, such as *Simple Gifts* (used in *Appalachian Spring*) and *At the River* are sure to leave us all beaming. We are excited to welcome Della Blood to perform Cecile Chaminade's *Concertino* for flute and orchestra. The concertino is a hugely popular work amongst flautists and was performed regularly by James Galway! We close with Johannes Brahms's *Symphony No.2 in D major*. The world première took place in Vienna conducted by Hans Richter in 1877 and was performed by the Vienna Philharmonic. The work was an instant success and has musicians and audience members cherishing the abundant melodies.

TCHAIKOVSKY - Symphony No.4

We are proud to welcome June Emerson Wind Music Young Artist, Winner of the Brass Category Final and runner up in the 2016 BBC Young Musician competition, Ben Goldscheider. Ben is studying at the Barenboim-Said Academy in Berlin and is currently wowing audiences across Europe. He will be performing Jiří Pauer's *Horn Concerto* in its UK première. Composed in 1952, the work is full of the vitality of Pauer's Czech homeland. We open the concert with a transcription of J.S. Bach's famous *Passacaglia and Fugue in C minor* by orchestra member, Paul Wilson. This masterpiece has been transcribed into many different forms by the likes of Stokowski and Respighi. To close the concert we visit the fate-riven *Symphony No.4* by Tchaikovsky. Composed in 1877-78, the symphony became an instant orchestral tour de force and is loved by all who play it.

Our final concert of the season opens with Debussy's *Prélude à l'après-midi d'un faune*. Completed in 1894, the composition is one of the most important milestones in classical music. It is hugely popular both with audiences and flautists, with its alluring flute solos and evocative orchestration. We are delighted to welcome local musician, Christina Waldock to perform Arthur Honegger's *Cello Concerto*. Composed in 1929, the work contains many simple phrases combined with light humour and jazz references. We close our season with a perennial orchestral favourite, César Franck's *Symphony in D minor*. Premièred on February 17th, 1889 at the Société des Concerts du Conservatoire led by Jules Garcin, the symphony gained huge acclaim from the outset, and was regularly performed during the 20th century. Full of wonderful melodies and motifs that return throughout the symphony, this work will lift your spirits on a warm summer's evening.
